Within 30 minutes, the car's interior can climb from 85° to 120°.

120° HOW HOT IS TOO HOT?

THINGS TO REMEMBER

- 1. Young, elderly, overweight, short-muzzled pets and pets with thick or dark-colored coats are most at risk for overheating.
- 3. It is prohibited by law in many areas to leave pets unattended in a vehicle under unsafe conditions, including a hot day.

2. A vehicle may overheat even with the windows left open an inch or two.

4. Shade moves with the sun and provides little protection on a hot day.

On an 85° day, it only takes ten minutes for the inside of your car to reach 102°.



Even if the temperature outside is only 70°, the inside of your car may be as much as 20 degrees hotter.
