insecticides

From fly sprays to ant granules, a variety of insecticides are used on horses and in their environments.

Always follow the label instructions and prevent exposure by keeping them stored safely away from the horses.



supplements

Many people give their horses nutritional supplements to support hoof health, joint health, and other purposes.

It's important to administer the correct dosage to your horse, as too much can lead to serious consequences.



lawn and garden products

Always follow the label directions when using herbicides or soil enhancements near horses.



rodenticides

Many rodent poisons are grain-based, making them irresistible to horses.

Make sure you're aware of what rodenticides you're using, and always keep them out of reach from your horses.



veterinary products

Oral dosing syringes may slip, leading to possible overdoses.

Always double-check the doses before administering any medication to your horses.



In addition to these common toxins, there are many poisonous plants that can cause harm to horses.
