Lilies beautiful, but deadly

Lilies may be pretty to look at, but they're incredibly dangerous to our feline friends. Stay informed about toxic lilies to keep your cats safe.



Toxic Lilies



Asiatic Lilies

Spot an Asiatic lily by its characteristic leaves that radiate off a central stem. Asiatic lilies often have large, trumpet-shaped blooms in a wide range of colors. All parts of the plant are toxic to cats.



Daylilies

Daylilies may look like Asiatic lilies, but the main difference is their distinct, grass-like foliage. All parts of the daylily plant are toxic to cats, so be careful when planting them in your garden.



Symptoms of Lily Poisoning

- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Lethargy
- Kidney Failure

Just a small exposure can potentially cause acute kidney injury, but if you catch it quickly, you can take steps to avoid life-threatening issues.

Get Reimbursed

The average cost of treating a lily exposure is \$1,292, and it increases to \$1,622 in multi-cat households.*
