# A Horse's Natural Defense Against Cold

A horse's winter coat traps body heat by fluffing up — but that's not always enough.

Age, living conditions, and body type all impact their ability to stay warm unaided.

#### **What Blanket Weight Should You Use?**





#### How to Measure for the Right Fit

- 1. Start at the center of the chest.
- 2. Run the tape over the point of the shoulder and down the length of the body.
- 3. End where the tail meets the buttock.

  That's your horse's size in inches!

5 Things That Influence Blanketing Decisions

# **Hair/Coat Type**

- Full winter coat? May be OK without a blanket.
- Clipped or slow-growing coat? Likely needs one.





# **Living Situation**

- Has access to shelter? May not need extra coverage.
- Exposed to the elements? Use waterproof protection.

#### Age

- Older horses struggle to regulate temperature.
- A blanket helps them conserve body heat safely.





# **Body Condition**

- Easy keepers: more insulation = less need.
- Hard keepers: blankets prevent calorie loss.

### **Climate & Acclimation**

- LCT = the lowest temp in which a horse must increase metabolic heat to maintain a normal body temperature.
- Depends on coat, fat, shelter access, and local norms.
- Consider rain, moisture, wind, and relative humidity alongside the temperature.



#### **Pro Tip: Be Prepared!**

Even if your horse is usually unblanketed, having the right gear on hand before a storm hits can make all the difference.
