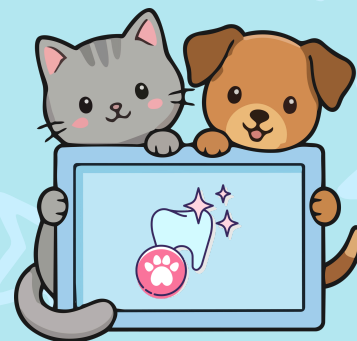

What is Periodontal Disease?

Periodontal Disease is a chronic inflammation of the tissues around the teeth that can lead to tooth loss and let bacteria spread through the bloodstream, affecting the **heart, liver, and kidneys**

Signs of Periodontal Disease

- Bad Breath
- Loose or broken teeth
- Inflamed gums
- Bleeding gums
- Difficulty chewing
- Sensitivity around the mouth
- Excessive drooling
- Loss of appetite
